


Gainsborough Primary & Nursery School Newsletter

Dear Parents/Carers

This week pupils have been exploring the importance of staying safe online, including when using mobile phones, as part of Safer Internet Day which was on Tuesday. Each year, Safer Internet Day covers a new theme. For Safer Internet Day 2024, the theme is 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. This can be from very simple changes that may happen when using the internet or resources online e.g pop ups, accidently clicking links, a video moving onto another video automatically to much more impacting changes such as profile settings changing, privacy settings changing or hacking.



Mrs Appleby has been visiting classes in EYFS and KS1 this week to help the children learn about Keeping our body parts private.

It is also Children's Mental Health Week. Children's Mental Health Week was launched nationally in 2015 and each year, hundreds of schools, children, parents and carers take part. Now in its 10th year, the theme this year is 'My Voice Matters'.

My Voice Matters is about empowering children and young people by providing them with the tools they need to express themselves. Children and young people who feel that their voices are heard and can make a difference have a greater sense of community and self-esteem. Here at Gainsborough the children have been swapping classes and chatting to each other - listening and valuing talk.

Online Group Chats

We have had a number of reports and complaints around our children's use of 'online group chats'.

This is a request for ALL Gainsborough parents to take an active role in safeguarding our children online.

More and more children are being requested to join group chats and many of these contain a significant amount of swearing, abusive language, bullying, inappropriate photographs/videos, and some cases sexualised language.

Please:

Sit next to your child if they are on their phone/device. Make sure you can see their screen. Ask them to talk you through exactly what they are doing. Encourage children to leave, block and report group chats if they become unkind.
 Spot check their phone daily. Read their search history and read their conversations on WhatsApp/TikTok/Snapchat etc.

Children who are exposed to this kind of online activity are telling us that they feel sad, unhappy and stressed after being in these groups chats.

Most social media platforms that allow group chats are age rated 13+ and even 16+ and primary school children need constant support from their adults to help them navigate complex social arenas.
