School Vision

The targeted and strategic use of Pupil Premium funding will ensure that there is no significant gap between the achievement of pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium and other pupils in the school. We recognise that not all pupils who are eligible for pupil premium are socially disadvantaged and further, some children who experience disadvantaged backgrounds are not eligible for pupil premium funding. We ensure that all pupils who have additional needs receive high quality provision which helps them to thrive, regardless of their status as disadvantaged or non-disadvantaged. Provision for Pupil Premium pupils who are not at risk of underachieving academically may take the form of curriculum enrichment.
