Communication and language

Key learning: Good sitting, listening ears, taking turns talking, joining in with stories and rhymes. Following instructions, asking for help or assistance, using clear pronunciation of words.

What pupils will learn:

This area of learning is used to promote children's ability to speak, pay attention, listen and understand. This is done in a variety of ways: listening to stories, developing their own narratives to share with others, small group activities to emphasise the importance of listening and taking turns to speak.

Personal, social and emotional development (PSED)

<u>Key learning</u>: Share, taking turns, helping, caring, play alongside and with others, show empathy and pride.

What pupils will learn:

This area of learning promotes positive relationships that children develop with their peers and adults. It enables children to understand and talk about their feelings, develop independence and confidence, helps them to feel valued and gives them a sense of self-worth.

Literacy

Key learning: Nursery rhymes, books, pictures, print, pages, holding a pen correctly, drawing circles and lines, reading our names, writing our names. What pupils will learn:

This area of learning focuses on early mark making and writing. At this stage children are learning to hold a pen correctly and draw circles and lines, as well as begin to write their own names. It encourages children to talk about and share books and begin to recognise key words and logos.

<u>Maths</u>

<u>Key learning</u>: read and write numbers to 5, name shapes, order items by size

What pupils will learn:

This area of learning enables children to learn number names through counting and joining in with rhymes and songs. Children will have the opportunities to explore, sort, compare and count. This supports them to be creative, critical thinkers and problem solvers.

I can say some number names in order I can sing some number songs and rhymes I can name 2D shapes I can use words such as 'big' and 'little' to describe things I can order items by size

Expressive Art and Design (EAD)

<u>Key learning</u>: representing things in picture form, playing role play and imaginative games, making music and beginning to move in time to music.

What pupils will learn:

This area of learning promotes imagination, creativity and skill to use media and materials. This is done in a variety of ways which include: singing, dancing, making music, playing with colour and texture and design.

Understanding the World (UW)

Key learning: growing plants and flowers, watching the changes, caring for plants, using technology What pupils will learn:

This area of learning focuses on how children make sense of their world and their community, by creating opportunities for them to explore, observe and find out about people, places, the environment and technology. Children will learn about planting and growing flowers and vegetables.

Physical development (PD)

<u>Key learning</u>: Wash and dry hands, joining in with routines, running and negotiating space, holding a pen, balancing on one-foot, physical movements **What pupils will learn**:

This area of learning is used to develop a child's movement and handling of objects. They are learning how to independently change their own clothing, develop an understanding of their own body, health and levels of self-care. They are developing their groaa and fine motor skills.
