Literacy

<u>Key vocabulary:</u> letter, sound, phonics, phoneme, grapheme, name, write.

What pupils will learn:

We will continue to write our names each morning. We will be reading lots of exciting stories and discussing the different vocabulary.

I know how to write simple sentences using CVC words.

I can use Fred talk and my phonics knowledge.

I know how to quickly recall letter sounds.

I can use Fred fingers to help me to blend and segment.

I know how to blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter—sound correspondences.

I know how to form lower-case correctly.

I know how to spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.

Communication and Language

<u>Key vocabulary:</u> days of the week, months of the year, weather, register, lesson, morning, lunchtime, afternoon, home time.

What pupils will learn:

We will learn new words to help us be successful and be happy at school.

I understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.

I will understand the importance of listening to peoples' ideas.

I know how to use new vocabulary to help me to express myself.

I will listen to questions and have a go at answering them.

Reception

Spring Term 1

Animals

Our author this year – Oliver Jeffers



Focus texts:

- Walking in the Jungle- poem
- The Pig in the Pond
- Rumble in the Jungle
- Commotion in the Ocean
- Farmer Clegg's Night Out
- Celebrating Chinese New Year

Maths

<u>Key vocabulary:</u> shape, number composition, subitise, double, number bonds

What pupils will learn:

Explore the composition of numbers to 10/ number composition

-Explore different ways to make the same number.

E.g - 5 + 2 = 7, 4 + 3 = 7, 3 + 4 = 7

Subitise

-Show small quantities in familiar patterns (for example, dice) and random arrangements.

Count to 20

Count verbally beyond 20, pausing at each multiple of 10 to draw out the structure, for instance when playing hide and seek, or to time children getting ready.

Compare numbers

Count and estimate groups of objects in different numbers.

2D and 3D shapes

Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes – side, corners, straight, flat and round.

Positional language

Understand position through words alone. For example, in front, behind, above, on top.

Personal Social and Emotional Development

<u>Key vocabulary:</u> Teeth, hygiene, clean, healthy, unhealthy

What pupils will learn:

We will be focusing on the importance of brushing our teeth and personal hygiene.

I know how to brush my teeth properly and why it is important for our health. I will explore what food is good for our teeth and which food can damage our teeth.

Understanding of the world.

<u>Key vocabulary:</u> Growth, seeds, life cycle, plant, animal, Spring, seasons, occupation, people who help us, map.

What pupils will learn:

I will plant seeds and care for growing plants. I can understand the key features of life cycle of plant/animal.

I know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos.

I understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them.

I can show an interest in different occupations
I can explore and talk about different forces I can feel
I can draw a simple map.

I know that there are different countries in the world I recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

Expressive arts and design

<u>Key vocabulary:</u> Sing, perform, instruments, dance, pitch, melody

What pupils will learn:

I will create my own songs or improvise a song around one I know.

I can play basic instruments with increasing control to express my feelings and ideas.

I can watch and talk about dance and performance art, expressing their feelings and responses.

I can sing in a group or on my own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody. I can develop storylines in my pretend play.

I can explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.

<u>**Key vocabulary:**</u> move, jump, walk, run, hop, cut, throw, catch, apparatus

What pupils will learn:

I can refine my fundamental movement skills: • rolling • crawling • walking • jumping • running • hopping • skipping • climbing

I can progress towards a more fluent style of moving, I can develop the overall body strength, co-ordination, balance and agility

I can develop my small motor skills so that I can use a range of tools competent.

I can use my core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor

I can combine different movements with ease and fluency

I can confidently and safely use a range of large and small apparatus.

I develop a range of ball skills including: throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting.

I develop confidence, competence, precision and accuracy when engaging in activities that involve a ball.
