S.U.M.O. stands for the phrase Stop, Understand, Move On.

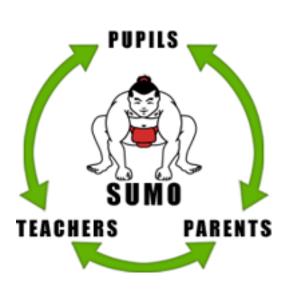
#### 'Stop, Understand' means

SUMO is meant to be a challenging, thought provoking and memorable message.







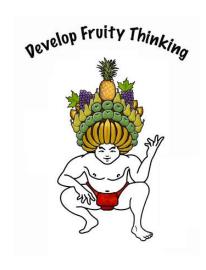

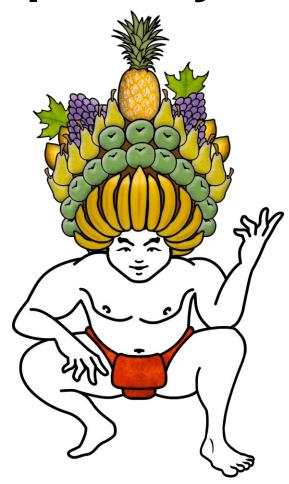








## **Develop Fruity Thinking**

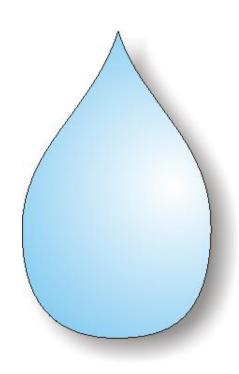

The Broken Record – You moan about the same things all the time but you don't take action.



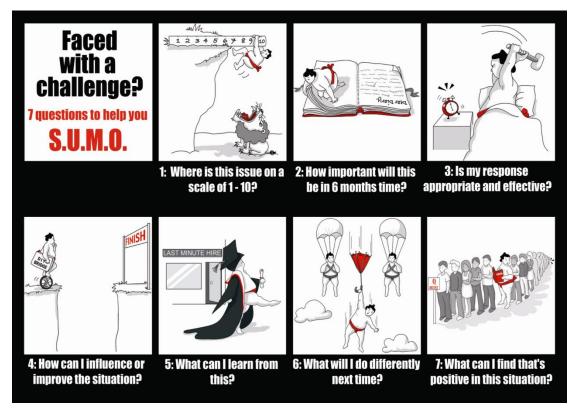
Martyr Syndrome – You think your life is unfair and that people are better than you.

## **Hippo Time is OK**

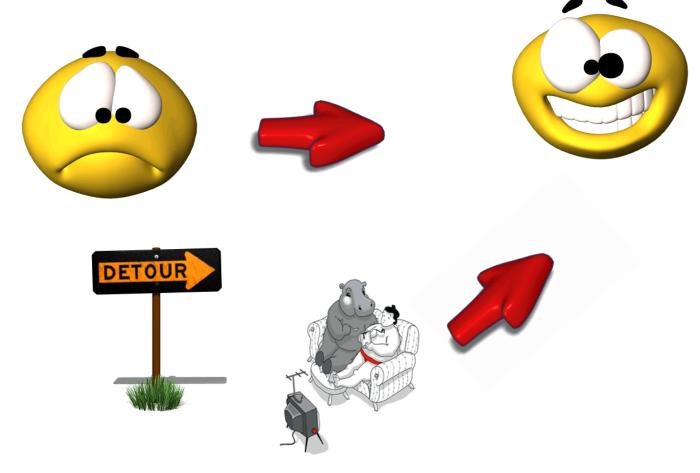




- Before we can SUMO we may need to take a detour to Hippo Time.
- Remember the more times we replay our story, the more we re-live it. Sometimes we need to SUMO rather than re-tell.
- Stop telling everybody our issues and Move On to people who will be supportive.
- Be aware the longer we spend in Hippo Time the harder it will be.
- "Hippo Time" is temporary. SUMO lasts a life time.

- Your pen runs out of ink

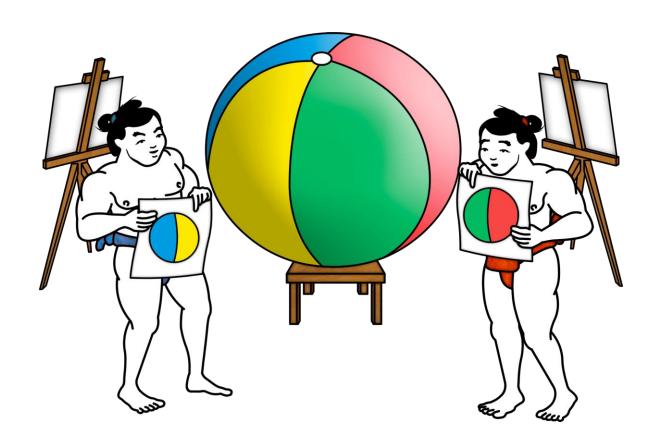








#### Remember the Beachball

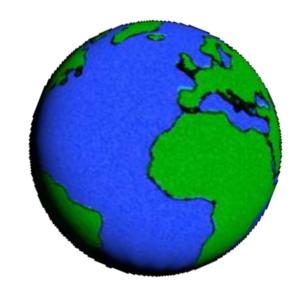


#### **SUMO Summary**

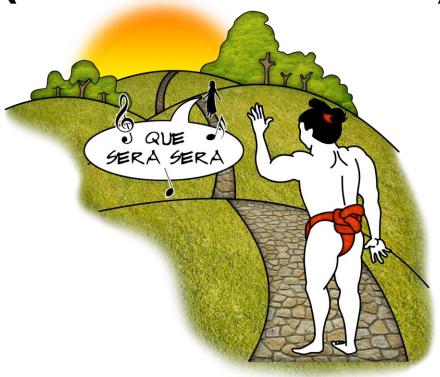








## Ditch Doris Day (or dare to dream)
