Weekly Sendco Drop-In At Gainsborough


We offer a weekly drop-in for parents/carers to have a brief chat with our SENDCo, Mr Simpson, every Friday morning.

Year 6

This week, year 6 have been revisiting the names and properties of both 2D and 3D shapes. They have been able to distinguish the difference between a face, a vertex and an edge. The children have also used their knowledge to investigate building three dimensional shapes from nets. They have revised that a two dimensional figure can be folded to create a three dimensional shape. Our year 6 children have then worked hard to compare and classify these geometric shapes based on their properties, size and nets.

The year 6 statutory assessments are not far away now, it is imperative that your child/ren are getting enough sleep, eating an healthy breakfast and are completing their reading/homework tasks. It is also important that your child is on time to school every morning as we use this time to revisit learning in preparation.
