


# Gainsborough Primary & Nursery Academy Newsletter

### Year 2


We will be holding a Stay and Read Year 2 workshop from 8.50am-9.20am on November 13th. There will be a short presentation offering reading and comprehension strategies to help your child with their reading at home. After, you and your child will share some reading time together in the classroom. The children really love this activity as they enjoy having you in school and showing you the books we have to offer.

Year 2 have started this term using their detective skills! A bag arrived at school with lots of strange items inside giving them clues about our new English text. The children looked at each item and predicted where the story could be set, who the characters could be and possible problems that might happen in the book. They loved this activity and predicted that the story will be set in a park with trees. The gardening gloves and tools made the children think that a gardener could be one character and the aged 5 shorts made them predict that a little boy will be in the story. The children also found a sign with the word orphanage on, so we explored the meaning and guessed that this might be an important building in the story.
